During non-open hours you can utilize the Ring doorbell and a staff member (if available) will meet you at the museum

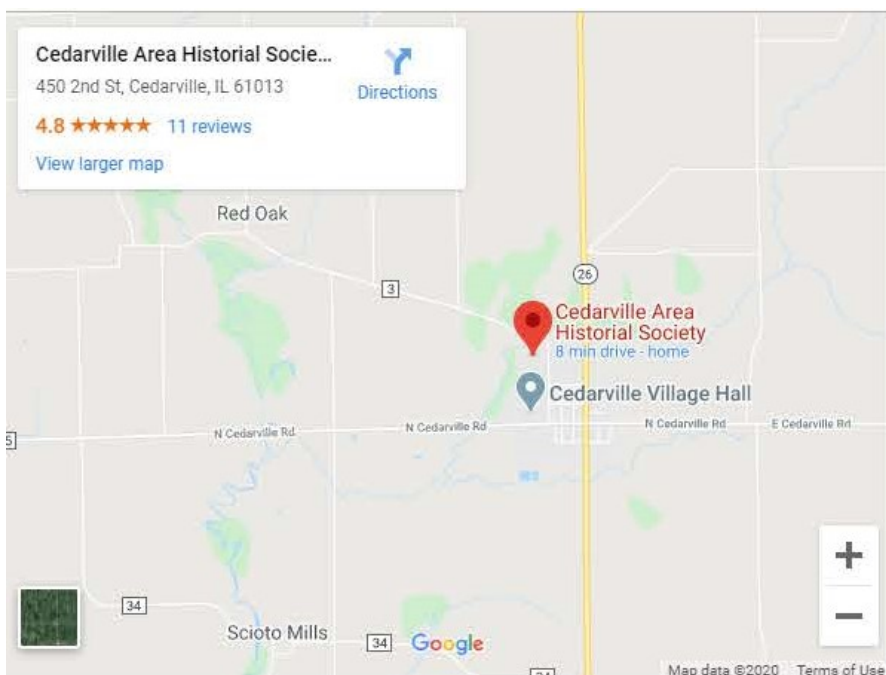
