## Celebrate Cedarville

Many Cedarville residents or visitors will immediately recognize this building. Reed's Garage, located at the corner of Rte 26 and Cedarville Road was opened in August 1948 by Donald Reed. Donald's son Gene went to work for him at the station from June 1949 to December 1951. At that time Gene entered the Air Force returning to the station in January 1956 where he worked with his Dad until January 1, 1967. Gene then bought the business from Donald. Tradition carried on and Gene's son John began working for his Dad in August of 1974, junior year in high school. John is now the proprietor of Reed's Garage and can be found at the building either at the front desk or back in the garage working on a vehicle. In a recent meeting with John, he shared many stories of the station, including the addition of the second door/stall in the 50's. Included in his stories was the fact that often times executives of Sinclair would come visit the garage and approve (AND pay for) things such as new floors or painting of walls). John also recalled that they had many customers who would come to the garage on Sundays (yep open seven days a week) to pick up the newspaper and perhaps a candy bar available at the front counter. Also it was like the local watering hole, where tales and current events were shared. I am hoping to get John to share more tales of the garage and some of the great Cedarville sport stories that he knows

A little family history: Donald Reed(b.2-03-1906/d. May 1973) and his wife Ruth Lucille Rote Reed (b. 7-15-1910/d. 11-17-2002) were married and had two children, a daughter Donna Reed Untersee (b.3-10-1929/d.12-17-2016) and a son Gene Reed (b. 12-19-1931/d.12-09-2020) who married Mary Kaiser Reed (b. 8-18-1931/d.10-21-2016) on December 19th, 1953. They had a son John (b.9-2-1958) and a daughter Kathleen (b.11-10-1954/d.5-07-1993)

### **Cedarville Players**






Museum is always available by appointment
