Cedarville Native, 97, Passes

Florence LaBorde Evans, 97, Cedarville native, died June 18 in her Freeport home.

Mrs. Evans was born on a farm east of Cedarville in 1923 the daughter of Charles and Ida (Zurbriggen) LaBorde. She married Donald Evans in October, 1941. He died in 1989.



Mrs. Evans first at-

tended Champion Hill School which was located between Alfokey and Dakota and then Orangeville High School. She was graduated from Freeport High School.

In 2013 she donated to the Cedarville Museum the well preserved and highly decorated LaBorde "friendship quilt" containing the embroidered names of thirty Stephenson County residents. The quilt is currently on display at the museum immediately to the right of the parking lot door.

Mrs. Evans and her late husband worked together in the family business, Evans Electric in Freeport.

She was a member of Embury United Methodist Church and the YWCA. She was a den mother and girl scout and brownie leader. She also volunteered at Malcolm Eton Enterprises and was a Pink Lady at FHN. She loved gardening and crafts and was an avid golfer with

her late husband.

She is survived by her daughter Debra Valentine of Tallahassee, Fl., brother-in-law Russell Kundert and many nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents, husband, son, Donald, daughters, Patricia K. and Kathy Lou, grandson, Raphael, and brothers, Jack, Robert and Richard LaBorde, and sister, Alfreda Rusk.


